Oh what a difference a year can make. The many changes addressed by the National Office have changed the way we will do the NASC 2008 Trip.

*All students **must** register directly with the National Office – this can be done on line – please make sure that you mark **individual** not state delegation on your registration form.

You **must** pay on line for the convention - cost \$385.

*You **must** have an advisor who is

attending the convention.

*Your conference advisor **must** have hotel room arrangements for you.

*You **must** bring all signed medical and consent forms to the convention.

*Your cost for the bus is \$150 dollars. The bus will leave from Collinsville High School on June 24 in the afternoon. If you wish to save a spot on the bus you **must** email me at gclark51@yahoo.com or call me

at 618-580-7667. The bus will be returning after candle lighting on June 29 – arriving in Collinsville in the morning of June 30.

*Your cost for State shirts is \$50. You **must** inform me of your shirt size and I **must** receive payment no later than May 12.



IASC Summer Leadership Workshop Information
