
Quick Tips for a successful Honor Council Book

- 1. Read all materials you receive from the Honor Council Committee
- 2. Determine your method of honor book completion.
- 3. Submit your Honor Council Application to the IASC Secretary by February 1, 2016.
- 4. Read through the honor council score card.
- 5. Highlight the things that your school has done or plans to do before the 2016 State Convention.
- 6. Schools who are new to the honor council program may want to send a mini-book.


7. After outlining the activities that you have already done, or

plan to do, try to do some of the other activities indicated on the score card.

- 8. Be sure that all pages in the book are secure, even when the book is turned upside down! Clear plastic page holders are recommended.
- 9. All rules stated in the guidelines apply to both e-book and regular book entries.
